#### 1. NEW FOUNDATION SCHOOLS WEBSITE IS LAUNCHED

## Supported Return to Training (SuppoRTT)

The supported Return to Training (SuppoRTT) programme is a HEE initiative which aims to support all trainees to return to training safely and confidently after a period of absence. A range of options are available; these are targeted at those absent for three months or more, but those absent for a shorter period may opt in. # 3. RESPONSIBLE OFFICER - STFS

All South Thames Foundation School trainees currently have the same Responsible Officer (Dr Alec (Graeme) Dewhurst). Please note this is regardless of whether you are employed in a London NHS Trust or in a Kent, Surrey and Sussex NHS Trust.

# 4. FULL GMC REGISTRATION FOR NON-UK GRADUATES

In order to start the second year of the Foundation Programme (F2) you need to apply for full registration with a licence to practise with the GMC. You should submit your application as early as possible to make sure you have the correct registration in time to start your F2 post.

#### • Apply for full registration

To make your application, please visit the <u>Applications</u> section of the GMC's website and read the guidance that is relevant to you. You can then make your application online.

## Check your registration status before working

Before you start F2, you must make sure you have the correct registration status. You can do this by checking the online <u>List of Registered Medical</u> <u>Practitioners</u>.

## • If you're not in training

Remember, you can hold <u>provisional registration</u> for a maximum of three years and 30 days. If you are not in training or want to take a break, you should <u>give up your provisional registration</u>.

# 5. LEAVING EARLY – WITHDRAWAL/RESIGNATION

<u>Reminder</u> - If you wish to leave before the official end date of your F1 or F2 programme in order to take up other employment/training opportunities, you will not be signed off as having met foundation training requirements.

## All those wishing to leave are required to complete a withdrawal form.

# 5. REMINDER OF THE NEW PROCESS FOR STUDY LEAVE FUNDING

Apart from ALS, generally courses requesting approval fall into two categories: optional and aspirational. Optional is for a single approved course linked to career intentions and can be approved by trusts.

An aspirational course is one which <u>does not</u> appear on the mandatory or optional London and KSS study leave lists; for example, a doctor presenting a paper at a conference may apply for support.

Requests for funding for aspirational courses along with all the relevant information, such as details of fees and expenses and Trust approval should be sent to the relevant Foundation School Director. For overseas courses only fees are remunerated, not expenses.

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Please note we can no longer accept paper applications and <u>all</u> Local Swap applications must be made via the <u>support portal</u>. Trainees must have received written confirmation from their FTPD or Supervisor and the second applicant, that they agree, prior to submitting the application.
