

Daily Consultant-led bench round (Blood cultures, respiratory, enterics, urine, wound/swabs, mycology and serology), with the Infection Control Nurses and Antibiotic Pharmacist.

It is usually the F2s' responsibility to contact the clinical teams with positive culture results each morning and obtain a brief summary of the clinical picture to present on the bench rounds.

With time, the F2 is expected to be able to provide basic advice when discussing positive cultures. However, all advice given must be conferred with the microbiology consultant on the round.

In addition to the bench round, telephone consultations are received throughout the day. These are usually taken by the consultants but the F2 may take them if the consultant is busy or unavailable. They will expect the F2 to discuss any advice they give, particularly when they start.

There are some weekly antibiotic rounds or meetings with specific teams e.g. ITU on Wednesdays.

There is a TB/Infectious Diseases clinic is every Wednesday afternoon: The F2 sees patients on TB treatment and checks for compliance, side-effects and ensure adequate response to treatment. Management of all cases is discussed with the SpR/Consultant in clinic. Occasionally, non-TB patients will also be in clinic.

Infectious Diseases MDT every Friday: Formal paper ward round where the ID patients are presented by the F2s/SpRs and discussed.
