This is an acute frailty ward with a high turnover. A variety of cases present with acute and chronic conditions that will have a consultant review at least every other day. You will be expected to attend all ward rounds and care for patients to whom you are allocated. This will involve carrying out your own examinations and making a management plan during ward rounds which are not consultant lead. Ward jobs include making referrals, ordering, sometimes taking and chasing bloods, doing ABGs, requesting and chasing tests, speaking with other specialties regarding any relevant issues that arise. Prescribing medications based on blood results, carrying out a septic screen for acutely unwell patients following trust protocol and using trust guidelines.
